

Print curves

Print curves controls the color response of the press output. Print curves use multiple channels to calibrate response independently for each separation. The **Print Curves** tab shows all the print calibration curves, transfer curves, device curves, simulation curves, and conversion curves you created in the system for tonal calibration or color relationship management.
