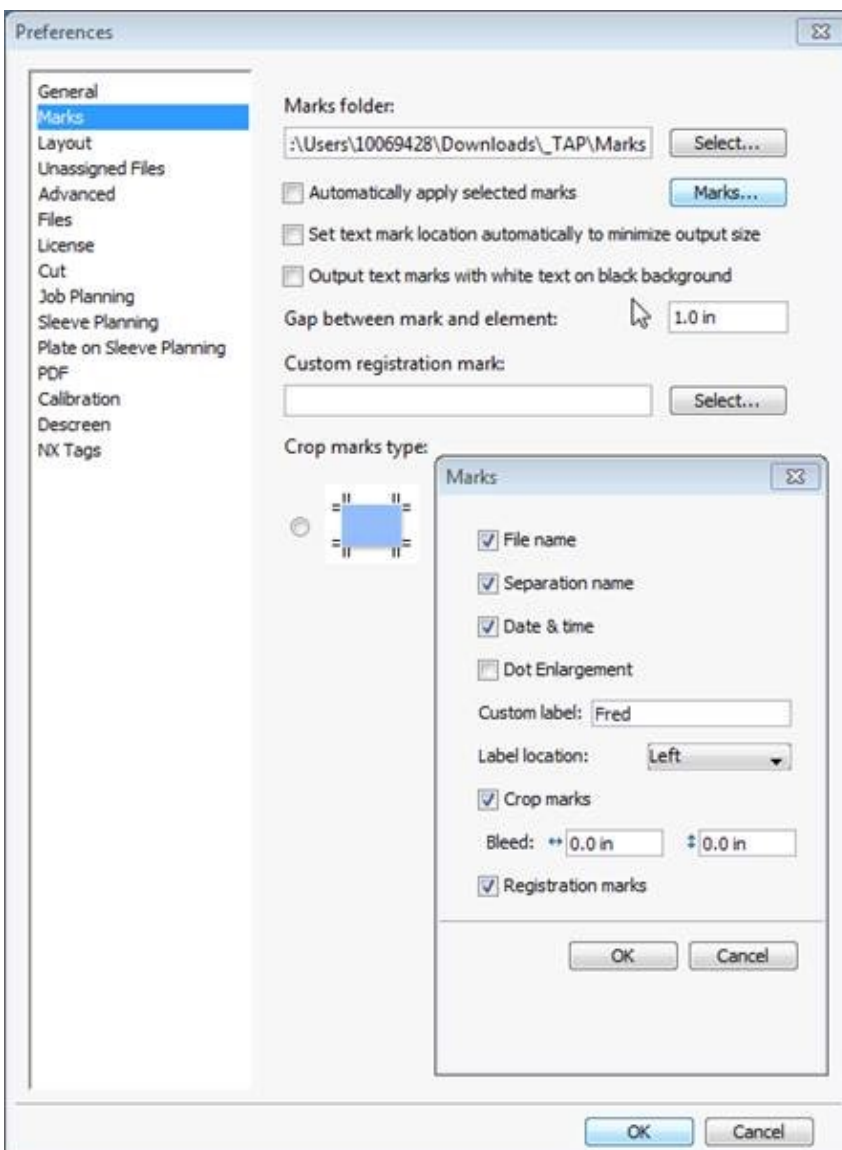


## 9. Set the cut area to include or exclude separation marks

In the default **Cut** Preferences, the **Include marks** option is enabled—any marks associated with the separation will be included in the cut area. For this activity, you will produce a layout first with the marks included in the cut area and then with the marks excluded from the cut area.

Set the Marks Preferences to automatically apply marks

1. Select **Edit > Preferences > Marks**.
2. In the **Marks** Preferences, select the **Automatically apply selected marks** check box.
3. Beside that option, click **Marks...**
4. Select the **File name**, **Separation name**, and **Date & time** check boxes.



5. Click **OK > OK**.

Create and output a layout with marks included in the cut area

1. In the **Cut** Preferences, make sure that the **Include marks** check box is selected (default).
2. Start a new layout.
3. Add the files from the **Lesson 2** folder to the layout.
4. Arrange the files with the following settings:

**Arrange**

Sheet size: Custom 640.0 mm 838.0 mm

Alignment: Top Left

Element gap: 0.0 mm 0.0 mm

Direction: Horizontal

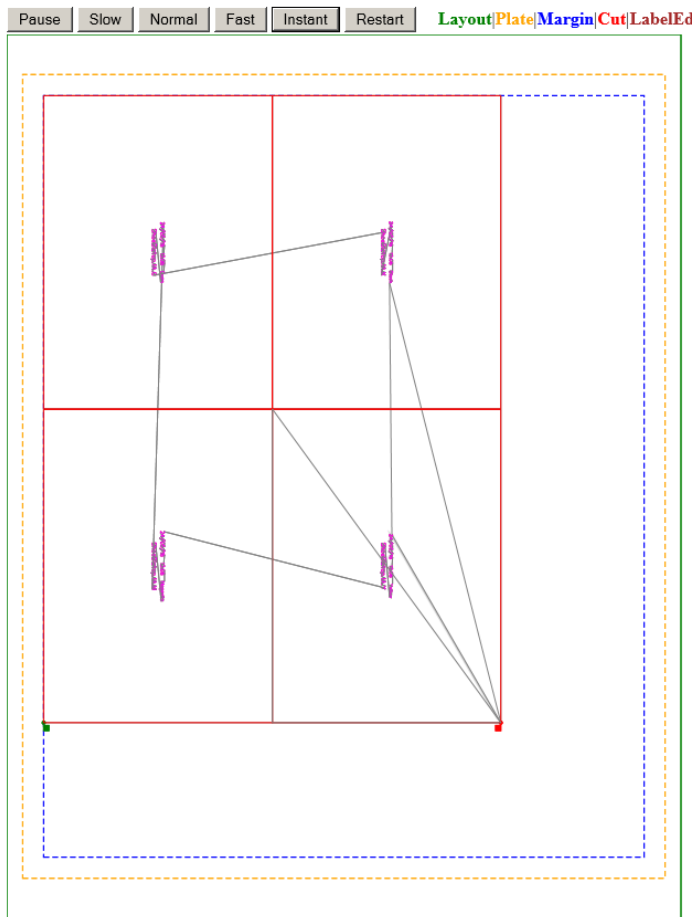

5. Output the layout.

## View the results

1. View the HTML cut file. Notice the absence of gaps between the separations. The separation marks are included in the cut area.



Output the same layout with marks excluded from the cut area

1. Select **Edit > Preferences > Cut**.
2. Clear the **Include marks** check box.
3. Click **OK**.
4. Output the layout.

### View the results

1. View the HTML cut file.  
Notice that you can now see the gap between the separations. The separation marks are in the gap, which is excluded from the cut area.
